Lois B. White, 88, of the Mayflower Home in Grinnell died Sunday morning, April 12, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services for Lois White

were held Wednesday, April 15, at the United Presbyterian Church in Malcom, with the Rev. Daniel I. Ogata, pastor of the church, officiating. Music was provided by Margaret Wheeler, organist, and the Rev. Keith Briggs, soloist.

She worked for Grinnell college from 1957 to 1965, and also worked as a volunteer at Grinnell General from 1964 to 1984. She moved to the Mayflower Home in 1984.

She was a member of the Malcom Presbyterian Church, where she served as an elder and taught Sunday school. She was a member and Past Noble Grand of Chapter #119 of the Rebekah Lodge of Grinnell, a member of the Fidelity Lodge #118 Ladies Encampment Auxiliary of Grinnell, a member of the John R. Lewis Auxiliary #59 Lodge of Grinnell; a member of Grinnell Temple #198 of the Pythian Sisters where she served as Chief and treasurer and a member of the Nazareth Chapter #37-White Shrine of Jerusalem of Newton. She also belonged to the Malcom Worthwhile Club, the Farm Bureau and the Malcom Co-op.

She is survived by her children, Doris Pearce of Grinnell and Kenneth White of Waterloo; and seven grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband in 1970; and her sister, Marie Agnew Bolen.
