Mrs. Wilhelmina Wiese died of bronchitis, terminating in heart failure, at the home of her only daughter, Mrs. Fred Heinle, on Friday afternoon, at 1:30, Feb. 10, 1911, aged 74 years, 9 months, 14 days.

Wilhelmina Dehnk was born April 26, 1836, in Schoenberg, Schleswig-Holstein, Germany. She was the fifth of a family of eight children, of whom all but two have passed on before her. She was married to Henry Wiese in the year 1861, in Krokau, residing there until April, 1881, when they moved with their daughter, Bertha, to Walcott, Iowa, remaining there a few years, then moving to a farm in Malcom township. Later they made their home with their daughter and son-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Heinle. She is survived by her husband, Henry Wiese, daughter Bertha, two sisters, Mrs. Bertha Schreiber of Walcott, Ia., and Mrs. Louise Schneckloth, of Malcom, Iowa, and three grandchildren, George, Alena and Eleanor Heinle. At the age of 14 she united with the Evangelical Lutheran church, of which she has been a member all during her life.

She was devoted to her work, a true friend and a comfort and blessing to all who had the privilege of knowing her well. The services were conducted Sunday afternoon at 2 at the home by the pastor, A. Mathias of the German Lutheran church in Malcom township. The music was furnished by Mrs. J. S. Stoaks and her Sunday school class of young ladies. The body was laid to rest in the Hazelwood cemetery.
