of recovery, and she decided to re-
turn while she had sufficient strength
and die under the care of loved ones
at home. She leaves two daughters,
aged respectively 18, and 16, to
mourn her loss. Her husband and
children have assurance of warm
sympathy from neighbors and
friends, and they doubt not she has
gone to join the society of the re-
deemed to be forever with the Lord.
