SUGAR CREEK (Special)—Roy Williams, 90, died Sunday at Friendship Manor. Funeral services for Mr. Williams were held Tuesday in Oskaloosa, with burial at the Friends Cemetery in Lynnville.

The son of James Albert and Sarah Elma Ratcliff Williams, he was born Nov. 2, 1885. He attended Lynnville High School and was graduated from William Penn College in 1912.

On June 3, 1914, he was married to Ada Conover. The couple moved to the Sugar Creek area where they farmed. They moved to Oskaloosa in 1926.

Mr. Williams was active in the Iowa Yearly Meeting of Friends and served on the William Penn College board of trustees. He had also served as a missionary in Jamaica.
