Conduct Services Here Today For Daisey Wilson, 80

Mrs. Daisy A. Wilson, 80, of Grinnell, died Monday evening at a local hospital following an illness of the past several months.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Thursday) from the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. Wayne Shireman, pastor of the First Baptist church, officiating. Vocal music was provided by Mrs. Noel Taylor, accompanied by Mrs. Kathleen Heffner at the organ.

Flower bearers were Mrs. Glen Riddle and Mrs. Don Turner. Pallbearers were Howard Davis, Keith Davis, Jack McGinnis, Jerry McGinnis, Rollie McGinnis and George Wilson. Interment was in Hazelwood cemetery.

She was the youngest child of a family of seven children of Mr. and Mrs. David Anderson and was born near Livonia, Mo. on Nov. 22nd, 1882. She received her education in the schools near Livonia. Her family resided briefly in Kansas while she was a young girl.

On Oct. 29th, 1899, she was united in marriage with Felix (Dick) Wilson. To this union were born two daughters, Mrs. Paul (Marie) Davis and Mrs. Clarence (Violet) McGinnis, both of Unionville, Mo.; and four sons, Perry and Harold (Tex), both of Grinnell, Acie of Winterset, and one who died in infancy.

In addition to her five children, she is survived by 22 grandchildren, 45 great grandchildren, one great great grandchild, and one brother, Dick Anderson of Queen City, Mo.

She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, one son, and five brothers and sisters.
