Harvey Mills Woodle, son of Robert Vance Woodle and Clara Stella Barber Woodle, was born July 9, 1887, at Brooklyn and died Sept. 14, 1966, in Veterans hospital at Iowa City. He was one of eleven children and had lived in this vicinity all of his life. He attended schools in this area and worked as a day laborer and for the railroad. He was a World War I veteran and was discharged Sept. 12, 1918. On Sept. 9, 1959, he married Dora Haines Lundy.
