 Theodore J. Wozny, 60, of 1910 Country Club Dr., Grinnell, died Tuesday evening, March 2, in the coronary care unit of Grinnell General Hospital.

The Mass of the Resurrection was celebrated at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at St. Mary's Catholic Church, with the Rev. Harry H. Linnenbrink officiating. Organist was Kathleen Heffner.

After working briefly for Woolworth's, he joined the Nebraska Continental Telephone Co. in Columbus. His telephone career took him to several areas of the com-

pany, which later became part of General Telephone Company of the Midwest. He has been a resident of Grinnell since 1958.

On March 9, 1940, he was married to Eleanor Starkey a Waverly, Neb. The couple had four children.

During World War II, he served as a technical sergeant in the U.S. Army's 33rd Infantry Division in New Guinea, the Philippines and Japan.

During his 39-year career with General Telephone, Mr. Wozny served as lineman, cable splicer, installer-repairman, crew foreman, outside plant construction supervisor, district and division manager, general plant manager, and manager in the personnel and training departments.

He was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church and was active in church CCD programs. He was also a member of the Knights of Columbus, Grinnell Elks Lodge No. 1266, and the Grinnell Country Club, which he had served as president. He was a charter member and a member of the board of directors of Joseph L. VanHorn Club of the Independent Telephone Pioneer Association.

Survivors include his wife, Eleanor; his children, Mary Kay Wozny of Columbia, Mo., Geoffrey A. Wozny of Stow, Mass., Timothy J. Wozny of Grinnell and Jeanne L. Gaylord of Philadelphia, Pa.; four grandchildren; and two sisters, Dorothy Cromwell of Genoa, Neb., and Adeline Drum of Columbus, Neb.
