

Herbert Yeisley Rites Pending ^{H-R}

Herbert Yeisley, 68, of 1601 Tenth Ave., Grinnell, died suddenly Sunday evening at Grinnell General Hospital.

The son of Willard and Helen Flower Yeisley, he was born Feb. 26, 1904, at Blairstown, Iowa. He received his education at Blairstown High School and the University of Iowa. On Sept. 21, 1930, he was married to Belle Ryan at Jefferson, S.D. Mr. Yeisley represented the Metropolitan Life Insurance Co. for 12 years in Sioux City, and later was associated with the Coons Motor Co. in Sioux City.

In 1950, Mr. and Mrs. Yeisley came to Grinnell where he purchased the Chrysler-Plymouth agency. In 1955 he sold the auto agency and operated the Ben Franklin Store in Brooklyn for three years. In 1962 they moved to Boonville, Mo., to operate a Coast-to-Coast store before returning to Grinnell to make their home in 1963.

Mr. Yeisley had been in ill health since 1965 when he suffered a stroke and had been forced to discontinue activity the past seven years. When in better health he was a member of Grinnell Elks Lodge No. 1266.

He is survived by his wife Belle; one brother, Ralph Yeisley of Omaha, Neb.; and three nephews and one niece. He was preceded in death by a brother, Horace.
