

Services Held For Ivy V. Young, 74, Kellogg Resident

Services for Ivy Vernon Young, 74, a long time resident of the Kellogg community, were held from a Newton funeral home Wednesday afternoon. Young died early Monday at his home near Kellogg.

Rev. Floyd Newbrough, pastor of the Kellogg Methodist church, conducted the services. Burial was in Our Silent City cemetery in Kellogg.

Surviving Young are his wife, Clara; two daughters, Mrs. Harold (Imogene) Kooistra of Newton and Mrs. Ruth Moore of Avalon, Catalina Island, Calif.; a son, Vernon, of Newton; and two grandchildren.

Four brothers survive. They are John of Iowa City, James of Marshalltown, and Todd and Frank of Newton. A sister, Mrs. Leola Toft of Canoga Park, Calif. also survives.

He was born Jan. 19, 1884 on a farm near Kellogg, the son of Nimrod and Leanna Young. He married Clara Garner, Dec. 31, 1908 at Newton after being educated in Jasper county schools and at Newton Normal College.

Young, a farmer by occupation, resided in the Kellogg Community all of his life with the exception of the time from 1940 to February, 1958 when he lived in Indianola. He was a member of the Methodist Church and a charter member of the Amboy Grange.
