MAX R. YOUNG

Funeral Services for Max R. Young, 75, of Shawnee, Okla., were held at 11 a.m., Saturday, May 9, 1987, in Grace United Methodist Church, Brooklyn. Mr. Young, a former resident of Brooklyn, died early Wednesday, May 6, in the Presbyterian Hospital, Oklahoma City, Okla.

Rev. Raymond D. Moore, Pastor of the Grace United Methodist Church, officiated. Organist was Mrs. Carol McClenathan, casket-bearers were Ray Frimml, Max Montgomery, Robert Roudabush, Ernest Andes, Denver Miles, and Melvin Doty. Interment was in the IOOF Cemetery, Brooklyn.

Max Ronald Young, son of William Henry Young and Lona Etta Harrington Young, was born December 12, 1911, in Clearwater, Kan., and died May 6, 1987, at the age of 75 years, 4 months and 24 days.

Mr. Young received his education in Brush, Colo., where he graduated from high school and received a Business Degree from the Denver School of Business.

He was united in marriage to Mabelle Irene Means on July 3, 1937, in Brush, Colo. They moved to Brooklyn from Lusk, Wyo., in 1951. He was employed by Means Service Store for 25 years retiring in 1976. Mrs. Mabelle Young died in 1983.

Mr. Young was united in marriage to Lillie Agnes Marler on July 28, 1984, in Shawnee Okla., where they made their home since.

Mr. Young was a member of Grace United Methodist Church, and served on Brooklyn City Council for many years and on the Board of Directors of Brooklyn Mutual Telephone Co.
