Mrs. Crisman to Head Red Cross War Production Work in County

GOOD WORK!

According to Mrs. C. C. Crisman, new chairman of the Poweshiek county Red Cross war production committee, at least 1,500 units of clothing have been made by Poweshiek's volunteer workers and shipped to New York since the first of the year.

This total includes:

- 152 layettes.
- 153 hospital pajamas.
- 102 hospital bed shirts.
- 350 women's and girls' dresses.
- 509 sweaters.
- 109 boys' shirts.

These articles add up to 1875, altogether, and at least 150 miscellaneous pieces of clothing and knitted goods have been included in the shipments.

Chairman of Refugee Garments Committee For 2 Years.

Mrs. C. C. Crisman, who has served the Poweshiek county chapter of Red Cross for the past two years as chairman of the refugee garments committee, has been named chairman of the war production work for the county, succeeding Mrs. J. L. Fellows.

Mrs. Fellows has headed the war production work for the past two years and under her leadership the county's Red Cross quotas have been met and surpassed with regularity. She was first introduced to Red Cross work during World War I, when she was one of the Poweshiek chapters most active volunteers.

As head of the war production committee, Mrs. Crisman will direct the efforts of about 60 women who make up county sub-
