The son of Amiel Edmond and Della Eva (Remery) Cleppe, he was born on Jan. 20, 1920, in Grand Mound, (a first generation born in America). He grew up on several rented farms near Brooklyn, Hartwick and Chelsea, where he helped farm and attended country schools until eighth grade. He worked as a hired farm hand for Walter Rich near Chelsea, and later he lived at home and farmed northwest of Chelsea. After the bombing of Pearl Harbor, he entered the Army Air Corps on Feb. 10, 1942, at Fort Des Moines and was sent overseas to the European Theatre of Operation. When the war was over, he returned home a Corporal on Dec. 16, 1945 and

returned to farming with his brother, Theophille, east of Tama. Cleppe was married to Idella Christian Dutoit on Feb. 6, 1950, at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Tama. The couple farmed near Tama, Chelsea, Belle Plaine and Victor where they had a family of their own. In December of 1975, He sold his farm animals and equipment and moved to Victor. He owned a truck and hauled grain and livestock; he also worked for M&N Grain and Rohrer Brothers. He later retired from the elevator, but continued to help his son-in-law, Bill Beran, farm south of Victor.

He was a member of St. Bridget Catholic Church in Victor, a member of the American Legion Hall, Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) and the Knights of Columbus.
