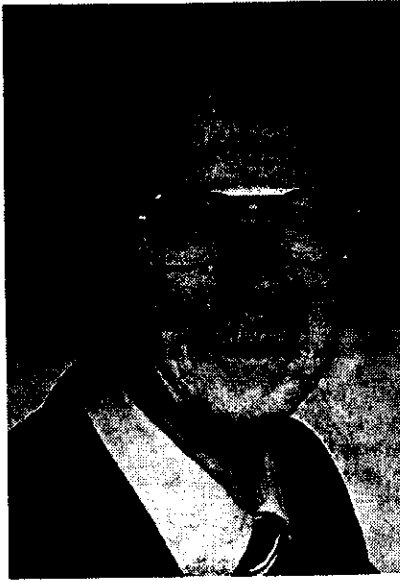


Floyd L. Innis



Floyd L. Innis, 86, of 208 Fifth Ave., Grinnell, died Friday, Feb. 6, 2004, at Grinnell Regional Medical Center.

A funeral service will be held Wednesday, Feb. 11, at 10:30 a.m. at Smith Funeral Home with John Epperson, pastor of Grinnell Christian Church, officiating. He was born Sept. 6, 1917, in Grinnell to James Rueben and Martha Crisan Koger Innis. He was raised in Grinnell and attended Grinnell schools. He served with the United States Army in the South Pacific theater during World War II.

He was married on March 11, 1946, in Albert Lea, Minn., to Barbara Jean Foster. The couple lived in Grinnell and he worked for a local painting service. In the early 1950s he began a 30-year career with the Maytag Company in Newton; he was for many years supervisor of the southwest machine shop in Plant #1 for Maytag.

He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Grinnell American Legion to which he volunteered many hours of his time and UAW Union #997 in Newton.

He is survived by two sons, Floyd L. Innis Jr. of Newton and Gary W. Innis of Springfield, Ill.; seven grandchildren and four great grandchildren; one brother Virgil Innis of Newburg and one sister Helen Johnson of Grinnell. He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife; one great granddaughter; one sister Reva Van Draska and three brothers, Raymond, Clarence and Loren (Zeb) Innis.
