Spec. Steven Keith Limbo, 21, of Lynnville, a member of the 101st Airborne Division of the United States Army stationed at Fort Campbell, Ky., died Saturday, Jan. 11, at Vanderbilt University Hospital in Nashville, Tenn., after being injured in an automobile accident near Fort Campbell.

A funeral service will be held Saturday, Jan. 18, at Pence Funeral Home in Newton with the Rev. Morris Hurd of the Kellogg United Methodist Church officiating.
