
## Art H. Grosenbach, 87

Art H. Grosenbach, 87, of Grinnell, died Monday, Aug. 24, 2009, at Friendship Manor Care Center in Grinnell.

He was honorably discharged as a second class petty officer aviation machinist mate in Minneapolis, Minn., in February of 1946.

In their early years, the couple farmed and had a dairy herd in the Poweshiek County area. He then worked at Miracle Recreation in Grinnell, was a salesman at Maples Chevrolet in Newton, and was the Justice of the Peace for Grinnell. Most recently, he worked at Oakland Acres Golf Course mowing the greens.

Art accomplished many things over the years. He was honored to be in Grinnell's Hall of Fame for third basemen in softball. He was an all-conference bowler and served on several boards during his lifetime, which included the Elks Lodge, Eagles Club, the American Legion, and the Moose Lodge. He served on the board of trustees at the Eagles for several years.
