

C.M. "BUD" MORRISON

C.R. "Bud" Morrison, age 71, of Malcom died Sunday, Dec. 22, 1985 at his farm of a heart attack.

He was the son of Ruben and Neta Campbell Morrison and was born on March 12, 1914 at Mount Pleasant, Iowa. The family later lived in the Deep River and Malcom areas and he attended rural Poweshiek County schools.

On May 1, 1937 he was married to Agnes Timm at the Little Brown Church at Nashua. They were the parents of two children: Mary and Paul. They lived in Malcom where he delivered petroleum products for the Midway Oil Company of Rock Island, Ill. He also delivered lime and farmed near Malcom.

Mr. Morrison was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church south of Victor, where he was baptized and confirmed. He was a past member of the City Council of Malcom and the Malcom Volunteer Fire Department.

He is survived by his wife: Agnes Morrison of Malcom; his daughter: Mary Schultz of rural alcom; six grandchildren; four sisters: Mildred Johnston and Celo Christenson, both of Los Angeles, Calif., Esther Howard of Pulaski, Ia., Dorothy Timm of Ladora; and one brother: James Morrison of Pulaski, Ia. He was preceded in death by his parents; one son: Paul Ray Morrison; one brother: Billie Dale Morrison; and one sister: Mary Grier.

Funeral services were held 1:30 p.m., Dec. 26, at St. John's Lutheran Church south of Victor, with the Rev. Kenneth Bartelt, pastor of the church, officiating. Organist was Mrs. Marna Mohr.
