
Robert T. Kaloupek

Bob was born the son of William and Grace Thomas Kaloupek on Sept. 20, 1927, in Grinnell. He was raised in Grinnell and he graduated from Grinnell High School with the class of 1945.

He honorably served his country in the United States Navy as a communications technician second class from 1945 until 1949. Following his service, he attended Grinnell College for a short while due to injuries he received in a car accident. Bob then attended the University of Illinois in Champagne and received his bachelor of arts degree in marketing.

He was united in marriage to Marjory Reeves on Feb. 16, 1961, at the United Methodist Church in Grinnell. Bob served as the Poweshiek County treasurer in the early 1960s and then was the secretary of the Grinnell schools before his employment at Grinnell Regional Medical Center as comptroller in the 1980s.

Bob was a member of the Grinnell United Methodist Church and he was treasurer of the church, and the church foundation. He also was a member of the Grinnell Lion's Club and he served as treasurer since 1994.
