Kyle Keith Arthur, 31, died Saturday, July 2, 2011, near Sully.

## Motorcycle accident near Sully claims life

A motorcycle accident near Sully over the Fourth of July weekend claimed the life of Kyle Keith Arthur, 31, of Newton.

At a little after 8:30 p.m. on July 2, the Jasper County Sheriff's Office received a call reporting a serious motorcycle accident about a half mile east of Sully on F 62 East. The sheriff's office reports that evidence at the scene and witnesses indicated that Arthur was driving a 2006 Yamaha west on F 62 when he lost control while negotiating a curve. The motorcycle left the road, traversed a ditch, and came to rest in a small stream, trapping Arthur beneath the motorcycle. Injuries Arthur received in the accident were fatal. The Sheriff's Office report states that Arthur was not wearing a helmet, did not have a valid motorcycle license and that alcohol may have been involved in the accident.

The accident remains under investigation by the Jasper County Sheriff's Office which received assistance at the scene from the Iowa State Patrol, the Sully Fire Department and the Lynnyille First Responders.
