Charles Aaron Hewitt, age 91, died May 23, at Colonial Manor in Amana. Charles was born on Sept. 27, 1920 to the parents of Rollan and Myrtle Palmer Hewitt in Eldon. He was raised and attended schools in Eldon and formerly lived in rural Deep River.
