
Archie Earle Ryan

He graduated from Grinnell High School, where he played guard on the high school's highly successful varsity basketball team. During high school he also helped his father on the farm, and also worked at restaurants in town, including at Candyland where he learned to make an ice cream dish which he stirred up for visitors all his

He served four years in the U.S. Air Force, then studied for one semester at the University of Arizona before returning to Iowa to help his family provide care for his mother. He was united in marriage with Madonna Kay Wright of Nevada, Iowa, in November 1954. He later earned a Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering from ISU in 1958, and worked as an engineer and power consultant in Washington, DC. for the Rural Electrification Administration; in Grundy Center for the Rural Electric Cooperative; in Marion for the Central Iowa Power Cooperative; and overseas in Bangladesh, India, Nepal and the Philippines before retiring in 1999.

His devotion to his family was paramount to him. He loved golf and cribbage and, in later years, cards.
