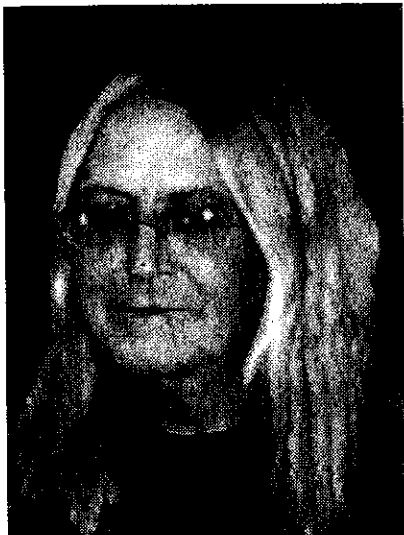


## Synthia Jean Osborne <sup>6H-R</sup> 3-13-2014
