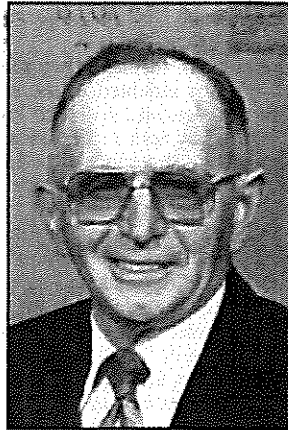


ROBERT WILLIAM LITTLE

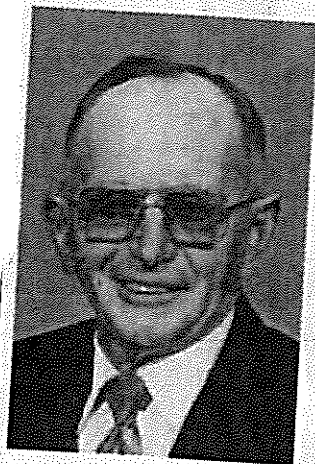
