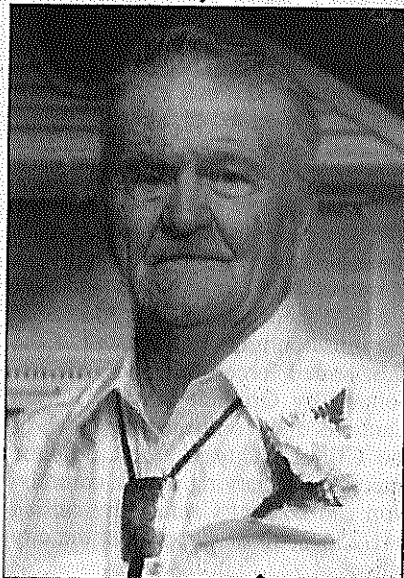


Donovan C. 'Smiley' Snodgrass

For many years, Don was an over the road truck driver which took him throughout the United States. He later drove locally for Monroe Feed Center, then retired in the early 1980s.

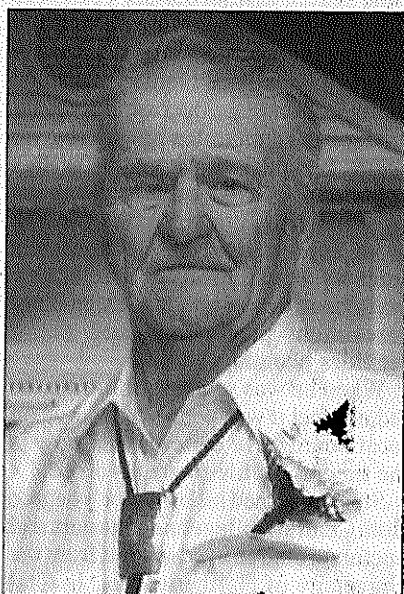
