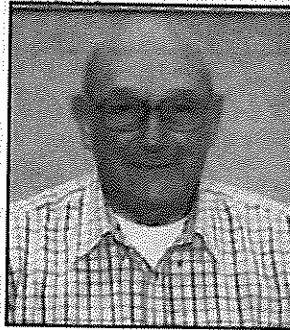


Record EVERETT A. IBURG 9-3-2015



Everett A. Iburg, the youngest child of Louis H. and Martha (Newkirk) Iburg, was born at Williamsburg on October 15, 1937 and died at his home in Victor on August 21, 2015.

Everett was baptized on November 14, 1937 at St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Williamsburg. Baptismal sponsors were Arthur Newkirk and Hilda Von Weihe.

Everett was confirmed at St. Paul's Lutheran Church on the 18th of March, 1951. His confirmation verse was Matthew 24:13.

Everett attended St. Paul's Lutheran School through the 8th grade and graduated from there on the 25th of May, 1951.

Everett entered the US Navy at age 17 in 1955 and was enlisted for 3 years, 1 month and 29 days. Attaining the rank of 3rd class petty officer and E4 pay scale and the navy referred to his service as the "Kiddie Cruise" (a ship full of 17-20 year olds).

Everett was united in marriage to A. Joan Safken on April 1, 1962.

Everett was active in the Victor community serving as a city council member, the cemetery board, volunteer fireman, church elder, church choir member, church offering counter, loved to have coffee with folks in the morning and loved model airplanes.

He was a faithful member of St. James Lutheran Church in Victor until the last few years of his life when health made getting around difficult.

Everett was preceded in death by his wife, Joan; parents, brother and sisters.

He is survived by daughter and son-in-law Leanne and Keith Brozek; three grandsons – Jeffrey (Lindsay Bohaty) Kyle and Gregory (Rachael Fangmeier); two sisters, Erna Davies and Florine Rowe; one brother, Louis (Leora) Iburg; and several nieces and nephews.
