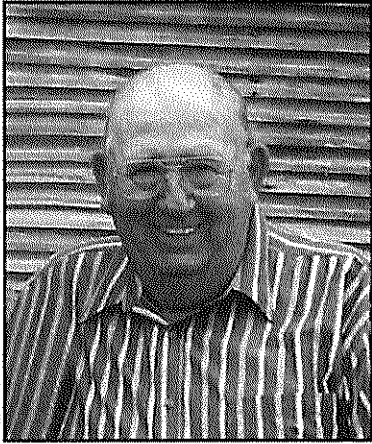


# Obituaries

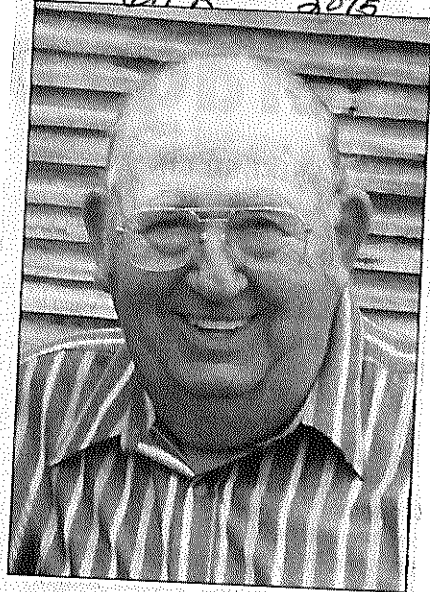
