ber of Pheasants Forever. He actively participated in Huntmaster's Club and his life reflected a strong commitment to the Huntmaster motto: "When you hunt and fish put back more than you take."

Ron had many hobbies including a love of cars and music ranging from polka and country western to big band. His passion was the great outdoors. As an avid outdoorsman he enjoyed hunting. He was a field editor for the Iowa Sportsman magazine and a co-host for Sportsman's Notebook on WHO.
