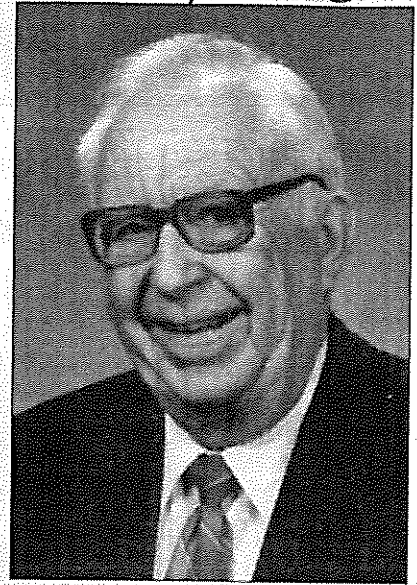


# Warren R. Miller <sup>GH-R</sup> 9-548-2016
