

J. P. O'Malley Fatally Hurt

Former Grinnell Resident Falls
Beneath Moving Freight
Train Wednesday

James P. O'Malley, about 60, of Newburg, Oregon, former Grinnell resident, died early Thursday morning from injuries received Wednesday night when he fell beneath a moving freight train. One leg was badly crushed, and O'Malley died from shock and loss of blood.

Mr. O'Malley was employed in Grinnell a good many years ago at the Clark Lumber yard, where York is now. He had spent some time at the lumber yard earlier in the week, as he was looking for work. Wednesday he went to Des Moines to find a job, and was fatally injured when he jumped off the moving train near the office of the American Railway Express.

The A. T. and T. truck came along shortly after the accident, and rendered first aid. He was taken to the hospital shortly after, but the shock and loss of blood were too much. He was also hurt about the head and face.

Mr. O'Malley was well known by Will Barnes, with whom he worked for about nine years while in Grinnell.

Chief Manson sent wires to Newburg, Oregon, yesterday, in attempt to inform Mrs. O'Malley of her husband's death. No word has been received from her as yet, however
