Former Grinnell Resident Falls Beneath Moving Freight Train Wednesday

James P. O'Malicy, about 60, of Newburg, Oregon, former Grinnell resident, died early Thursday morning from injuries received Wednesday night when he fell ing beneath a moving freight train. Mos One leg was badly crushed, and O'Malley died from shock and loss of blood.

Mr. O'Malley was employed in Grinnell a good many years ago at the Clark Lumber yard, where York is now. He had spent some time at the lumber yard earlier in the week, as he was looking for work. Wednesday he went to Des Moines to find a job, and was fatally injured when he jumped off the moving train near the office of the American Railway Express.
