

YOUNG MOTHER CALLED

Dread Pneumonia Causes Death of
Mrs. H. T. Anderson at Her Home
In This City.

LEAVES HER HUSBAND AND ONE DAUGHTER

Family Came Here From Newton Last
Spring -- Funeral at Home Mon-
day Forenoon.

Mrs. H. T. Anderson died Saturday
at 9:30 a.m. at her home, 632 Prairie
street, in this city, from pneumonia,
resulting from influenza. Her sick-
ness was of less than a week's dura-
tion, beginning the Sunday before her
death.

Jennie Marshall was born on a farm
in Warren county, April 18, 1894.
When she was two years old her mother
died, and she came to live with
her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. W. T.
Philip, who lived on a farm six miles
west of Grinnell. Here she grew to
womanhood and here engaged in
teaching in Jasper and Marshall coun-
ties.

Miss Marshall was united in mar-
riage to H. T. Anderson, June 12, 1915.
The young people made their home in
Newton after their marriage, where
they had until last spring, when they
established their home in this city.

The deceased is survived by her husband, one
daughter, Beatrice, aged two and one-
half years, and her aged grandmother,

Mrs. Anderson was a member of the
First Methodist church of this city, and lived
a quiet, silent Christian life. It is a sad
reflection that she left her little
daughter to be reared by other hands
just as her mother left her near the
same age.

Brief funeral service was held at
the home Monday at 10:30 a.m., con-
ducted by Rev. Joseph Sopher. Inter-
ment took place in the cemetery in
Rock Creek township.
