Virgil, formerly of Kellogg, went home to be with his Savior on Thursday, November 2, 2017, at the Grinnell Regional Medical Center.

Virgil was a Tool & Die Maker, employed by Midwest Manufacturing in Kellogg, and retiring after 42 years of service. He also was the Assistant Kellogg Fire Department's Fire Chief for 36 years. Virgil enjoyed his family, and was a member of the Farm Bureau, Iowa Firefighters Association and St. Andrew's Lutheran Church.
