Bryce W. Gause, 77, of Lynnville, passed away on September 20, 2018, at Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines.

Bryce was born on July 10, 1941, in New Sharon, the son of Lory W. Gause and Helen McConeghey Gause. He was raised in Lynnville and was a 1959 graduate of Lynnville-Sully High School. He attended the University of Iowa for two

Two of his proudest accomplishments were working with the Extension service to establish the Lynnville Marketing Club, which now serves farmers in Jasper and Poweshiek Counties, and being one of the incorporators and President of the Lynnville-Sully Education Foundation. Bryce was an avid golfer and Hawkeye fan. He enjoyed reading, traveling and visiting family and long-time friends from Indianola.

Survivors include his wife, Sheila of Lynnville; one brother, Lester (Kay) of Newton; two sisters, Nancy Barnhouse of Vero Beach, Florida, and Joan (Gary) Ales of Lakewood Ranch, Florida; two sisters-in-law, Peggy Gause of Roanoke, Virginia, and Susan Bandy of Houston, Texas; and many nieces and nephews.
