

During his youth, he developed a strong interest in computers and spent many hours at the computer center in Darby Gymnasium at Grinnell College. During his school years, he excelled in academics and music, being selected for All-State Chorus and Band. He was valedictorian of his graduating class at Grinnell-Newburg High School in 1979

Kevin attended Grinnell College from 1979-1983 where he majored in mathematics and was a member of the Grinnell Singers. His final semester was spent in Moscow studying Russian. Kevin was awarded the Archibald Prize, "given annually to the senior who has achieved the highest-grade point average during four years of study." He continued on to graduate school at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh where he received his doctoral degree in computer science in 1989.

He was a computer science researcher for NEC Research Institute, FastForward Networks, Inktomi, Overture Labs, and Yahoo Research. Kevin filed over 13 patents and published more than 30 research papers during his time at Yahoo, and he was recognized by the company as a Master Inventor in 2015.

Kevin was an avid reader and enjoyed biking, hiking and skiing in the California mountains near his home. Among his many varied in-

terests were photography and pinhole camera building.
