

Richard Lee Schrader July 18, 1945 - Aug. 3, 2019

Richard Lee Schrader, 74, of Greeley, died Saturday, Aug. 3, at Fairacres Manor in Greeley, CO. He was born on July 18, 1945 in Grinnell, to Cecil Raymond and Lucille Helen (Speck) Schrader.

Raised on a farm in Victor, he was graduated from HLV High School in 1963 and from the University of Iowa with a Civil Engineering Degree in 1968. On Dec. 18, 1966, he married Beverly Marie Wiedemeier at St. John's Lutheran Church in Victor They had known each other since they were 8 years old.

In 1968 they moved to Cheyenne, WY, and then to Fort Lewis, WA, where Richard entered the Army from 1969 - 1971 during Vietnam. Afterward, they moved back to Cheyenne where he worked for the Highway Department designing bridges. In 1978, the couple moved to Sheridan, WY, where he was employed with the

Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) until he retired in 1999, after 31 years with the State of Wyoming. Richard and Beverly retired to Greeley, CO, where Richard designed their handicap accessible home.

Though Richard was born with a degenerative condition, spinocerebellar CO; son, Clinton Schrader (Monica ataxia, he had a passion for fitness and Schrader) of Weddington, NC; grandliving life to the fullest. He especially loved bicycling and rode the RAW

to the Caribbean with close friends and also enjoyed attending Denver Broncos Games and Rockies Games.
