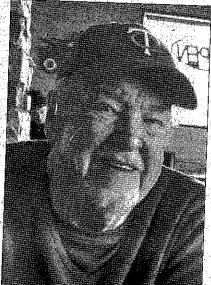
611-R James Alan Kottmeier 6-18-2020
