On December 21, 1950, they were united in marriage in Grinnell, and soon after they moved to San Diego. They both said it was for the sunshine!

Art joined the United States Navy in August of 1950 and served nearly four years as Aviation Electrician's Mate Airman on the USS Sicily and told many stories of his time in the war. He was awarded the Navy Good Conduct Medal, Korean Service Medal, United Nations Korean Service Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal. He was a very proud United States Veteran.

Art and Darlene bought one of the very first homes that were built in Allied Gardens in San Diego and the home is still in the family name. He began work at General Dynamic (Convair), where he had a long career of 35-1/2 years as an electrician.
