Mark S. Bowman, 64, of Choteau, Mont., died at home on Friday, November 13, 2020, of complications from pancreatic cancer.

Though he lived many places, his shirthplace of Grinnell, Iowa, was always home. There he attended school through college before going off to the University of Michigan Law School. His law career led him to St. Joseph, Michigan, where he would serve as City Attorney for many years. Well liked and deeply respected by all who knew him for his professional acumen, sense of humor and kindness, he remained in St. Joseph for 25 years. When he



quit law he took a position at Dartmouth College in Human Resources. He would work at Dartmouth and the University of Virginia for 10

years before his cancer diagnosis.

Faced with a shortened life Mark made a bold decision. He moved to Montana, marrying his longtime companion in a lovely ceremony on Swiftcurrent Lake in Glacier National Park. Together they had many outdoor adventures, from biking to hiking and backpacking in the Bob Marshall Wilderness.

He was a lifelong athlete, playing football and running track through high school and college. He had a stint as a camp counselor that changed his life and brought enduring friendships. He competed in many triathlons, more than 20 Chicago-to-Mackinac sailing races and one marathon; he maintained a long winning streak on the New York Times crossword puzzle with an average solve time of 13 minutes. But it was his unique manner of speaking and outlook on life that made him so memorable. "Bye for now" ended phone conversations; "strength and honor" was a creed he lived by; "bite the toad" was how he approached a difficult task. He liked to send birthday cards to everyone he knew because "it guarantees that for at least four seconds each year that person has to think of me."

It wasn't the cards that kept him in mind. He was the most loyal of friends, maintaining friendships over many decades and even more miles. He was smart, funny, unassuming, kind, and a Star Trek devo-

Among his final goals were to attend daughter Christine's wedding in July, to take a bike trip with two of his brothers in September, and to outlive Alex Trebek. He managed to achieve all three.
