
Harold F. Galloway



Harold F. Galloway, 92, of Grinnell died Monday, Feb. 5, 2007, at Grinnell Regional Medical Center.

He is survived by four children: Frances Smith of Chariton, Denton Galloway of Grinnell, Sandy Gethmann of Newton and Marlin Galloway of Grinnell; 12 grandchildren, 19 great grandchildren, two great great grandchildren and several step grandchildren, great grandchildren and great great grandchildren.
