Honorary fifefighter Mason Sieck, 7, was laid to rest on Friday, March 26, 2021, mourned by members of the Grinnell community, including 78 current and retired Grinnell firefighters and their families, 20 firefighters from neighboring departments, and staff and students of Fairview Elementary School

Firefighters wore their full dress uniforms to the Friday afternoon funeral

service in the GHS auditorium where Mason's turnout gear and helmet were placed on his casket. Firefighters at the service formed an honor guard lining the route from the auditorium to Old Betsy, the fire department's antique 1913 LaFrance fire truck, to salute as the casket was carried to Old Betsy for Mason's final journey. Pallbearers included firefighters and members of Mason's family, and honorary pallbear-

ers were members of the eighth-grade basketball team, which includes Mason's brother Colton, and members of the Grinnell Fire Department.

Mason's casket was carried in Old Betsy in a procession from GHS to Hazelwood Cemetery which passed under the crossed ladders of fire trucks displaying a large American flag at the intersection of Fifth and Spring by the fire station. Retired firefighter Dave

Standing on Old Betsy's rear platform was Mason's grandfather, firefighter Scott Sieck, flanked by Mason's great-uncles, firefighter Craig Sieck and refired firefighter Pat White. Mason's parents, firefighter Curtis Sieck and Sharina Sieck, followed Old Betsy in the procession.

The funeral procession was led by Grinnell Fire Chief Dan Sicard and included a school bus driven by retired firefighter Dave Thompson, filled with refired and current fire fighters and their

At the cemetery, firefighters formed an honor guard iming the path from Old Betsy to the gravesite to give Mason a final salute Firefighter Jed Petersen played the bagpipes during the inter-

ment service, and Schmidt rang a bell, traditional at burials of firefighters, taken from the era when ringing of a bell three times, then pausing, then unging three times, then pausing, then ringing a final three times signaled to firefighters that a fire was out, now used to signify "end of service" at the burial of a firefighter.
