A Celebration of Life Gathering, to honor the lives of both Vernon "Chip" and Pamela Gibson, will be held 1:00 p.m. Saturday, July 17, 2021, at the Grinnell Elks Lodge. Burial at Our Silent City Cemetery in Kellogg, Iowa, will take place at a later date.

Vernon "Chip" Gibson was born September 3, 1937, in Grinnell, the son of Marion and Florence (Beason) Gibson. Chip was united in marriage to Pamela Purvis on November 22, 2004. He was employed with Miracle Recreation and later Game Time Playground Equipment. He retired in 2003, a career spanning 30 years.
