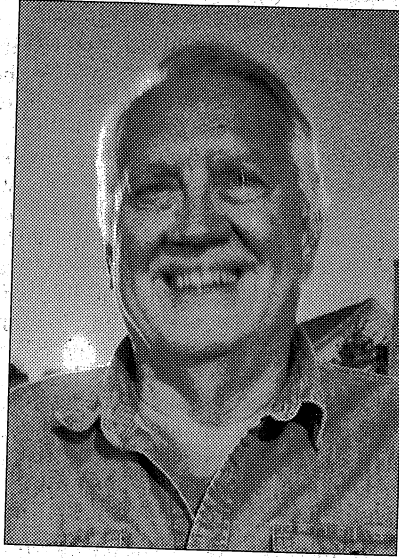

Tim Hoiien



Tim Hoiien, 71, of Brooklyn, died Wednesday, Jan. 25, 2023, at the V.A. Medical Center in Iowa City.

A funeral service will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Thursday, Feb. 2, at the Smith Funeral Home in Grinnell. Interment with military rites will be at Brooklyn Memorial Cemetery. A luncheon will follow at the Michael J. Manatt Community Center in Brooklyn.

Timothy Allan Hoiien was born the son of Russell and Jeanette (Huntley) Hoiien on June 4, 1951, in Estherville. He was raised near Ringsted until ninth grade, when the family moved to Malcom. He graduated from BGM High School in Brooklyn with the class of 1969. Following his education, Tim honorably served in the United States Army.

After returning home from the service, he began working at the elevator in Malcom. He had two children, Amy and T.J., prior to his marriage to Rhonda Read in 1986. They had two more children, Jessie and Cody, and farmed together near Brooklyn until Rhonda's passing in 1998. Tim later married Kristina Helleso in 2012; they resided near Holiday Lake and enjoyed countless motorcycle and truck rides together.

Tim worked alongside his life-long friend Ron Puls as an auto mechanic for many years. Tim operated a trucking business and freight brokerage service. Kenworth trucks were one of Tim's passions and he owned many throughout the years. He served on the Malcom Fire Department for several years. Tim's enjoyments included riding and working on Harley-Davidson motorcycles, working on old cars, and playing music.

Tim is survived by his wife, Kristina Hoiien of Brooklyn; his children, Amy Larson of Brooklyn, T.J. Hoiien of Reinbeck, Jessie Roudabush of Farmington, Minn., and Cody Hoiien of San Diego, Calif.; three grandchildren; two great grandchildren; and his siblings, Tom of Columbia, Mo., and Teresa of Sioux Falls, SD. He was preceded in death by his parents.
