She was the daughter of Michael and Elizabeth Lavan and born on August 30, 1892, at Trenton, N.J., She entered the convent in 1912 and was professed in August of 1915. She took her Life Vows on Sept. 28, 1919.

In 1921, two years after St. Francis hospital was established in Grinnell, she came to St. Francis and had resided there for 45 years. She celebrated her Golden Jubilee of 50 years of religious life in 1962.

Sister Margaret Mary was held in high esteem by many in the Grinnell area for having cared for the ill in their families, many of whom she had nursed for three generations.

She is survived by a sister, Mrs. Edwin (Elizabeth) Hart of Trenton, N.J., as well as several nieces. Preceding her in death were her parents, a brother and a sister.
