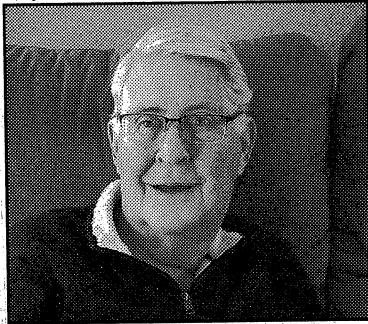

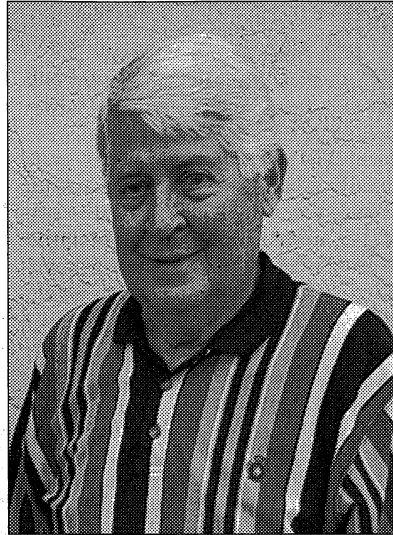

Jerry Melvin Iverson, 78, of Litchfield, Minn., and formerly of Grinnell, died Saturday, April 1, 2023, surrounded by family.

A Memorial Service will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday, April 11, at Cornerstone Church of Litchfield, with a visitation beginning at 10 a.m. Per his wishes, he will eventually be interred at Fort Snelling National Cemetery.

He was born in Saint Paul, Minn., on Aug. 13, 1944, to Melvin and Betty Iverson. His biological father was killed in a WWII plane crash and Milton Lefebvre stepped into the paternal role. Jerry was raised in the Minneapolis

area and graduated from Richfield High School in 1962. He then went on to obtain a business degree from the University of Nebraska, and then a degree in Advanced Accounting and Computer Science from the University of Iowa.

A captain in the US Air Force, Jerry and his family – his wife Mary Lou and their three boys – lived and traveled all over the world, everywhere from Wichita Falls, Texas, to Hahn Air Force Base in Germany. Following his service years, they moved throughout the Midwest – including living in Grinnell for a few years – and eventually settled in the Twin Cities metro where started his company, Healthcare Decision Systems, a cost accounting system for hospitals.

He had a passion for grilling, and the golf course was one of his favorite places: whether it was with friends, family or a solo game, Jerry truly loved the game.

He is survived by his wife of 57 years, Mary Lou Iverson; sons, Dave Iverson, Matthew Iverson and Jon Iverson; stepfather, Milton Lefebvre; eight grandchildren; one great-granddaughter; siblings, Paulette Hennebry, Jaqueline Buchholtz, and Andrea Galarneau; four-legged best friend, Jake; and many other relatives and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
