James D. "Jim" Henkhaus, 63, of Burlington, Wis., died Sunday, July 8, 2007, at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn.

A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated Thursday, July 12, at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Burlington with the Rev. Jeff Thielen officiating. Interment followed in St. Mary's Catholic Cemetery. Memorials may be made to the American Cancer Society or to St. Mary's Parish.
