Hannah Katherine Wilson

Hannah Katherine Wilson, daughter of Adam A. and Clarissa Jane Wilson, was born Dec. 1, 1864 at Libettyville, Jefferson County, Ia., and passed away in her home at Grinnell on May 2, 1946. She was 81 years, 5 months, and 1 day of age.

She is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Jennie Ward of Grinnell, and Mrs. Corrie Bartholow of Fairfield, four brothers, Hyman of Grinnell, Charles and Don of Denver, Colo., and John of Dunlap, Ill. Also surviving are four nieces and three nephews and their families. Preceding her in death were her father and mother, three brothers and two sisters.

Miss Wilson came to Grinnell in 1890, where she was successful as a dressmaker.

After the death of her younger brothers' wife in 1913, she and another brother, Hyman, opened their home and their hearts to his two children, Kathryn, now Mrs. L. J. Carney of Beaman, Ia., and John L. Wilson of Tullahoma, Tenn., whom they raised and educated with loving care and devotion.

Loved by all who knew her, she endeared herself to all the neighborhood children who knew her best as Aunt Kate.

She was a member of the Congregational church and was very active in the Eastern Star Chapter in which she held a Fifty-year membership since June, 1945.
