Monday Requiem Mass For Sister Mary Brigeta

Sister Mary Fogarty Brigeta, OSF, age 73, a member of the religious order of the Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, died Tuesday at St. Francis hospital here. Mother house of the order is at Mt. St. Clare at Clinton.

Requiem High Mass will be held at 10 a.m. Monday at the St. Francis hospital chapel here. The Rev. Vincent Putzer, SDS, chaplain of the hospital, will be the Celebrant. The Rev. Leo V. Kuebrich, pastor of St. Mary's Catholic church here,

will assist. The sermon will be given by Rev. Putzer.

Requiem will be recited at St. Francis hospital Sunday at 8 p.m.

She was the daughter of Michael and Mary Ryan Fogarty and was born July 3rd, 1892, in Nenagh, County Tipperary, Ireland. She came to the United States and entered the order on May 19th, 1910; received her habit on Dec. 31st, 1910; took her first vows on Aug. 15th, 1913; and her life vows on Aug. 15th, 1918.

Sister Brigeta served at St. Francis hospital here for several years and later was assigned to Mt. St. Clare and Mt. Alverno at Clinton.

She is survived by two sisters and one brother, Margaret, Bridget and Matthew Fogarty of Kilcolman, Nenagh, County Tipperary, Ireland. Also surviving are three cousins, Nora and Helen Fogarty and Mary Rentz, all of Detroit, Mich.

She was preceded in death by her parents and two brothers, Daniel Fogarty and the Rev. Patrick Fogarty.
