
64-R Dale Riley Lippincott



Dale Riley Lippincott, of Brooklyn, passed away at the age of 98 years, 8 months, and 10 days, Thursday, November 2, 2023, at the Mayflower Health Center in Grinnell, Iowa, with his wife, Helen, at his side. The devoted couple of 77 years lived in Brooklyn most of their lives, where they raised their three children, Donna, Joyce and John Dale. He was an 81-year member of Grace United Methodist Church and 63-year member of the Corinthian Masonic Lodge of Brooklyn. He was also a 76-year member of American Legion Post #294.

He and Helen supported their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren in all their activities, traveling many miles to enjoy football, basketball, baseball, and soccer games, track and wrestling meets and a variety of musical performances and recitals.
