

David "Dave" Mullin, 82, of Johnston, Iowa passed away on Thursday, November 16, 2023 at his home surrounded by his loving family.

Dave was born in Des Moines, in 1941. His parents were the late Leo & Carolyn Mullin and the late Bud & Virginia (Ellsworth) Sanford. Dave had three siblings.

Growing up in Des Moines, Dave was a true "East-sider" and graduated from East High School in 1959. He enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1959 stationed at Offutt Air Force Base in Omaha.

He was deployed to Madrid, Spain. With his love of sports, he was able to play on the Air Force basketball team as a center and traveled weekends playing teams from Germany and England. He also played baseball and was a pitcher for the Air Force team based out of Offutt Air Force Base. He was honorably discharged in 1963. He was extremely proud that he served his Country and was a true Veteran.

Dave started his career as a DI at KIOA in Des Moines, where he worked with Dick Young. He loved entertaining guests and running errands for Dick Young which was a highlight especially given his love of music. He eventually began working in the roofing trade at Iowa Roofing. His love of sports led to a coaching position in Lee Township Softball.

As head coach for the "Rosettes," his team and their winning streak set many records. All of his daughters began their softball years playing under Dave as their coach.

In 1963 Dave married and, in that union, had 3 daughters. In 1975 he met and married Sharon (Lewis Gooding) in which she had 3 daughters. Thereafter referred to as the "Brady Bunch."

In 1976 Dave and Sharon decided to move to the small town of Montezuma, Iowa. Dave started his own roofing company called "Dave's Roofing" and also drove a school bus during the school year. He loved being involved in school activities and especially driving the athletic teams to sporting events. As the girls began to leave the nest Dave & Sharon decided to leave Montezuma and start a new adventure although they both loved raising their children in Montezuma.

They began working together at Motel 6 in various offices throughout the country. Being valued as an exceptional, hard-working team, they were ultimately recruited by former managers to work for various Storage USA locations. This new career allowed them the opportunity to travel, meet many new people, and develop lifelong friendships. Their time together included many rescued 4-legged best friends. Their beloved dogs accompanied them throughout their years together. They retired in Naples, Florida. Dave and Sharon were married 44 years until her death in 2019.
