
## WILLIAM (BILL) L. EWING

May 1, 1937 - Jan. 8, 2024 U.S. Veteran

Bill attended Fort Dodge School. While living in Fort Dodge, Bill joined the National Guards and then the Marine Corps.

While on leave from the Marine Corp, William met Donna Jean Klinger and they were united in marriage on August 31, 1957. Following their marriage Bill returned back to Camp Pendleton, CA where he was stationed.
