Will was a man who loved his home and friends. His cheery smile will be greatly missed by all. All through his suffering he

never complained.

He leaves to mourn his loss, his wife, two sisters, Mrs. David Lincoln of Grinnell and Mrs. Perry Malloy of Bucklin, Mo., and four brothers, Pete, Mahlon and Clarence of Grinnell and Dan of Oskaloosa, also a host of relatives and friends.
